Conference Overview

The Eurosatory 2008 International Conference on Homeland Security in urban areas will look at the detection and prevention of terrorist incidents, at the development of sufficiently robust critical national infrastructure, at how best to manage the consequences of attacks and at how to improve the links between the civil and military arms of government in securing the most effective response to incidents.

French security and defence policy is currently under review by the Mallet Committee and its relevant conclusions will feature during the proceedings. France is about to take up the Presidency of the EU Council of Ministers and there is much interest in its thinking about the EU and NATO. This will be reflected in the discussions throughout the day.

Speakers from France, the United Kingdom, the United States and Canada will join in a wide-ranging debate over the difficult and demanding issues affecting governments and over the responses that are appropriate. A number of contributors will bring to bear the lessons of actual experiences in New York and London, as well as looking at the impacts of such huge natural catastrophes as Hurricane Katrina.

Industry has a critical role in providing the products and services that permit timely, robust and effective response and appropriate models and examples will be highlighted throughout the day. Homeland Security is often a less clear cut area of expenditure than in defence and contributors will discuss approaches on the most appropriate approaches to partnership with industry.

The particular importance of the police in dealing with homeland security is to be addressed by Police Chiefs from New York and London.
